This week is an important one for the COVID-19 vaccination programme across Derbyshire as we prepare to open three pharmacy-led sites, but it's important not to lose sight of the work already going on.

The fifteen existing PCN-led sites have been reaching out to people who are housebound and those living care homes, while the Derby Arena Vaccination Centre site continues to ramp up its activity.

I have been really moved this week to hear of so much public support and positive feedback, from donations of food from supermarkets to the kind words of those being vaccinated. It shows that the public appreciate and respect the work everyone is doing to make this vaccination programme a success.

As always, I would be extremely grateful if you could share this update as far and as wide as possible. Thank you in advance of your cooperation.

Latest developments - impact of the weather

The public have really been getting behind our vaccination teams, providing messages of support and even donations of food and other supplies. This is incredibly encouraging for all those working so hard at the vaccination sites, in the community, at care homes, and behind the scenes in offices and at home, to make this programme work.

In just one example, Savills Property Management at Derby Intu Centre has loaned Derby Arena seven wheelchairs, and South Derbyshire Council of Voluntary Services has provided an extra three.

I found the whole thing quite moving as middle aged children brought their precious elders along on walking sticks and in wheelchairs so they could be safe, at the same time knowing these people have mostly been tucked up away or isolating for nearly a year - it was all really well organised - solid effort NHS - hope this message gets back to those involved” - Vicky D.

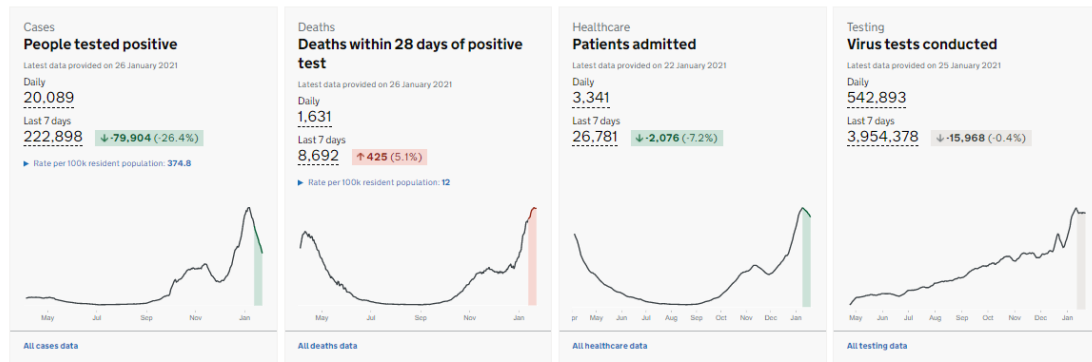

Vaccine updates and FAQs

Can people choose what vaccine they have?

- No. Any vaccines that are available will have been approved because they pass the MHRA's tests on safety and efficacy, so people should be assured that whatever vaccine they get will be highly effective and protect them from coronavirus.
- The Pfizer/BioNTech and AstraZeneca/Oxford vaccines are both being deployed by the NHS across the UK. There are no current plans to mix these vaccines.
- The Government's Vaccine Taskforce keeps its approach under review, ensuring the UK is in the strongest position to protect people. The science is uncertain about how mixing vaccines could produce a better immune response, so trials and testing will continue to assess and test vaccine responses.

Are regular cancer services still running during lockdown?

- Yes, even during lockdown cancer services in Derbyshire are here to look after you, safely.
- Even though we're being told to stay home, services are still open if you need them.
- If you are showing any of [the signs or symptoms of cancer](#) it is important that you contact your GP at the earliest opportunity.

Next Steps

Later this week, three pharmacy-led sites will begin vaccinations, complementing the existing Primary Care Network-led sites. They will take bookings through the National Booking System, which extends their reach beyond the PCNs and will give people more options for getting their vaccinations.

Significant work is going on to reach out to communities which traditionally do not take up vaccinations and we hope the link to the video clip above will help us to get important messages across about the importance of staying safe too. If you get the opportunity, please help to pass on the positive messages about the importance of vaccinations.

The National Booking System is sending out around 20,000 letters to homes inviting patients to book vaccination appointments. Please encourage family members and friends who receive these letters to make their bookings as soon as possible to keep themselves safe.
